

INTRODUCTION

What an expectant moment in the life of the Redeemer East Side (RES) congregation as we enter into a new chapter. After the myriad challenges of the Covid-19 pandemic, RES has emerged with a renewed sense of calling to love and serve this city well. We trust in God's provision as we search for a new pastor and lay the foundations for the new ministry center. Amidst all the changes, RES remains steadfastly committed to the five fundamental pillars of the New Testament church: devotion to the Apostles' teaching, joyous worship, intimate fellowship, sacrificial service and relentless evangelism (Acts 2:42-47). RES endeavors to earn the reputation characterized by the fruits of the Spirit: love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, gentleness, faithfulness and selfcontrol (Galatians 5). We seek to disciple (Matthew 28) and equip (Ephesians 4) our congregation to move into the world as the "fragrant aroma of Christ" (2 Corinthians 2). RES longs to see the name of Jesus made known around the world (Matthew 28).




CONGREGATION FOCUS GROUPS WHAT DO YOU THINK RES DOES WELL?



COMMUNITY GROUPS (CGS)

We believe that authentic community in this city is possible through Jesus Christ. RES currently has approximately 60 CGs with over 670 members. Composed of 6 to 12 people, CGs meet in person or online. All groups are led by trained lay leaders from our congregation who receive continued oversight and support from pastoral staff. In addition to Bible study, prayer and fellowship, many groups also participate in monthly service projects and social events.








SUNDAY WORSHIP




CONGREGATION DEMOGRAPHICS

- > 80% agree or strongly agree with RES vision







Ethnicity

STAFF AND LEADERS

RES currently has two ordained pastors on staff, Rev. Hector Sanchez and Rev. Rich McCaskill, and one interim lead preacher, Rev. Charlie Drew.

Executive Director Bruce Terrell leads the whole staff, oversees a staff Leadership Team – consisting of our two ordained pastors, Lyn Cook (Senior Director of Formation and Care), and Lindsey Schultz (Director of Children's Ministry) – and serves as moderator pro tempore of the Session.

The Formation Team (FT) is charged with pastoral care, CGs, and spiritual formation. FT members range from administrative





coordinator to Justice Manager and Community Life director, as well as three pastoral interns.

The Children's Ministry Team is charged with serving our families with children and consists of four staff members dedicated to nursery/preschool and elementary children; two Youth Ministry managers for middle and high school students and young adults; as well as a number of part-time nursery staff.

RES also employs: two music directors; a Sunday service director, operations manager, technical director, A/V specialists and other part-time workers on Sundays; a communications team for graphic design, photography, videography and web development, and a campaign coordinator.

1989

Dr. Tim Keller began to meet with a small group of people in an UES apartment with a focused prayer for a new church in the heart of Manhattan which led to the founding of Redeemer.

1993 Redeemer moved to Hunter College Auditorium as the congregation outgrew previous meeting spaces, a clear sign of the need and desire for the gospel in NYC. Since that time, it has sought to be a movement of churches. While growing as a congregation, it has supported planting churches both in the Greater New York Area and in other global cities.

1996 Multiple sites of Redeemer were established with the intent of setting up distinct locations instead of becoming a single-location "mega-church."

2010 Redeemer East Side (RES) installed its first lead pastor of the RES congregation, Rev. Leo Schuster, with the mission of forming RES into its own distinct congregation. He alternated preaching with Dr. Tim Keller. In 2014, Rev. Schuster resigned and launched a new church plant in Texas.

2015 Dr. Abe Cho, who had been long involved within the Redeemer network of churches, was installed as lead pastor of RES to assume responsibility for leading the RES congregation. Under his care, RES grew deep as a community – and he worked with the Session in 2020 to reshape the vision, mission, and values that would guide us as a church community.

2017 The ecclesiastical particularizing of RES formed it into an independent church of the Presbyterian Church in America (PCA), calling Dr. Abe Cho as senior pastor. (In November 2020, the church was particularized as a separate NY State church corporation.)

2019 Temple Israel became the meeting place for Sunday worship services when RES moved from Hunter College. Enabled by Rise Campaign funding and under RES oversight, Rev. Justin Adour, one of our assistant pastors, and about 20 congregants planted Redeemer East Harlem which will be particularized in December 2021.

2020 Born out of our commitment to church planting, Rev. Aaron Bjerke, one of our assistant pastors, along with several congregants were sent to plant a church in East Midtown, The Well, under the oversight of the Metro New York Presbytery. A new site for RES was purchased and the COVID-19 pandemic struck. The purchase of East 91st Street will allow RES to build a permanent home in the neighborhood for the congregation and better serve nearby neighbors. The global pandemic with the general shutdown of NYC required that RES move all activities online including worship and CGs.

2021

At the start of 2021, RES restarted limited in-person worship. The congregation received Dr. Abe Cho's resignation with gratitude for the years of his faithful ministry work and sent him with blessings toward his new, focused calling. The Pastoral Search Committee (PSC) was formed in June 2021.

The goal has always been to see the gospel of Jesus Christ go forth in truth and power to every people group, ethnicity, culture, borough, etc. of the city. When the gospel goes forth it will always go all the way to the fringes and to every ethnicity. Why start with the UES? First, because our church lives there and we want to love our neighbors! Second because Paul not only sought to reach the marginalized but also the cultural centers of influence (Acts 16 and 17)

Third, because in the relational and geographic context of RES, the neighborhoods of the UES are the beachhead to greater NYC, New York, and beyond."

QUALIFICATIONS

Ordained (or eligible for ordination) in the PCA with at least 8-10 years of pastoral and sessional leadership experience

Gospel-centered preaching in a method that communicates boldly and humbly to a diverse audience, including Christians and non-Christians

Strong Biblical character: consistently exhibiting spiritual maturity, integrity, purity and humility; prayerful dependence on God and a life above reproach

Ministry & Vision Fit: understands and embraces RES's DNA commitments of gospel centrality, church planting, cultural renewal, mercy and justice, cross-cultural community and missional discipleship

PREFERRED QUALIFICATIONS

Meaningful and effective ministry tenure in NYC (or urban center equivalent) for at least 10 years; have a heart for urban ministry and an acute awareness of both the unique challenges and opportunities that urban ministry affords

Exhibits visionary servant-leadership and be motivated to participate in the greater movement of churches in our city and world

- Strategic & Entrepreneurial Thinker: action-oriented yet reflective, and a self-starter
- Visionary: motivates, clarifies values, inspires to a specific future
- Collegial: works towards common goals and manages conflict well
- Aligner: unites people around a common vision
- Team Builder: develops, supports and empowers others
- Winsomely Evangelistic: personally engages with non-Christians and inspires others to do the same

May he be a winsome Biblical expositor who longs to effectively communicate the "whole counsel of God" to the saved and the unsaved; that through his giftedness, RES will be known as a place where honest questions are met with honest responses; that he may be culturally competent to convey the relevancy of the gospel to an often transient and skeptical audience.

Holy Spirit, may he be a man who burns to see your mercy and justice realized in NYC; a man who listens, unifies and genuinely values all races, all classes, all ages of individuals; a man who personally demonstrates how to love across difference; and a man who is committed to forming disciples who engage in their missional callings where they live, work and love. May he be eager to establish RES as a multi-generational, multi-racial congregation that honors your image bearers, where all feel loved, seen, welcomed and heard.

Father, may our new pastor be a model for the Sessional and Diaconate leadership, ministerial staff, program leadership and congregation. May his love of Christ, commitment to the Great Commission and Great Commandment, personal accountability, and love and appreciation for others foster unity and solidarity throughout the leadership and congregation.

Lord, may his leadership be characterized by humility, curiosity, innovation, faithfulness and friendship. And may he wholeheartedly labor to see a movement of the gospel rise up from the UES and spread throughout our beloved city and beyond, to the glory and praise of your holy name alone.
