SCRIPTURE 20 MINUTES

Read the following Scripture together. Then invite the group to respond through the questions below.

#### 1 Samuel 18:1-5 New International Version (NIV)

<sup>1</sup> After David had finished talking with Saul, Jonathan became one in spirit with David, and he loved him as himself. <sup>2</sup> From that day Saul kept David with him and did not let him return home to his family. <sup>3</sup> And Jonathan made a covenant with David because he loved him as himself. <sup>4</sup> Jonathan took off the robe he was wearing and gave it to David, along with his tunic, and even his sword, his bow and his belt. <sup>5</sup> Whatever mission Saul sent him on, David was so successful that Saul gave him a high rank in the army. This pleased all the troops, and Saul's officers as well.

## 1 Samuel 23:15-18 New International Version (NIV)

<sup>15</sup> While David was at Horesh in the Desert of Ziph, he learned that Saul had come out to take his life. <sup>16</sup> And Saul's son Jonathan went to David at Horesh and helped him find strength in God. <sup>17</sup> "Don't be afraid," he said. "My father Saul will not lay a hand on you. You will be king over Israel, and I will be second to you. Even my father Saul knows this." <sup>18</sup> The two of them made a covenant before the Lord. Then Jonathan went home, but David remained at Horesh.

# John 15:9-15 New International Version (NIV)

- <sup>9</sup> "As the Father has loved me, so have I loved you. Now remain in my love. <sup>10</sup> If you keep my commands, you will remain in my love, just as I have kept my Father's commands and remain in his love. <sup>11</sup> I have told you this so that my joy may be in you and that your joy may be complete. <sup>12</sup> My command is this: Love each other as I have loved you. <sup>13</sup> Greater love has no one than this: to lay down one's life for one's friends. <sup>14</sup> You are my friends if you do what I command. <sup>15</sup> I no longer call you servants, because a servant does not know his master's business. Instead, I have called you friends, for everything that I learned from my Father I have made known to you.
- ▶ What are the marks of friendship-love according to these passages?
- ▶ How do you think your community is demonstrating these marks of friendship-love?
- ▶ Could this kind of love influence your relationships across differences of ethnicity, gender, ideology, age, etc.? Why or why not?
- ▶ How is Jesus Christ's love for us on the cross a primary means by which Christians grow into loving character? What could you do practically to grow in love?

- ▶ Pray that "God's love will be poured out into our hearts through the Holy Spirit" (Romans 5:5), so that we would grow in love in all our relationships.

Grant, O God, that your holy and life-giving Spirit may so move every human heart and especially the hearts of the people of this land, that barriers which divide us may crumble, suspicions disappear, and hatreds cease; that our divisions being healed, we may live in justice and peace; through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.
